One goal is to identify training needs.</p> <p>PA #3 Access to Care</p> <p>Strategy #1 Increase awareness & access of existing healthcare services on preventive care</p> <p>Increasing access: Jeff –</p> <p>-KCH is working to coordinate all preventative care that takes place: annual wellness visits, free public health screenings, community events, and through work completed at worksites with employers</p> <p>-Info/data is being collected to assess the current state and then to develop strategies based off what is working/not working (transitions into Year 2)</p> <p>-Work is being done to promote these activities</p> <p>Strategy #2 Increase awareness & availability of birth control - Carmen</p> <p>-Carmen reached out to Amanda Poorman to begin discussion on increasing awareness and availability of birth control</p> <p>Strategy 3: Increase sexual health education and prevention: Carmen</p> <p>Cross Cutting Strategies Resilience Team–</p> <p>-What is next after showing Resilience video to community?</p> <p>- Goal is to become a trauma informed care community</p> <p>-Artic Surveys completed last year with organizations and work places, but, nothing came of it– discussed redoing these assessments.</p> <p>-Can we make it confidential for parents to connect with Triple P?</p> <p>-Susan is now doing more one-on-one counseling with court system & KCJFS. Concern- there is not enough resources available to meet these needs.</p> <p>-Chris – Showing the Resilience film at Kenyon, Gund Hall on February 19th.</p>	
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<p>Smoking Cessation – Mike Whitaker, KCHD</p>	<p>-Kay- problem is that we do not have any parenting prevention program. This county may want to consider providing more parenting prevention programs in additional to Triple P.</p> <p>-Carmen – piece to this is training providers to provide a pamphlet with parenting resources issues to connect them to support.</p> <p>-Gaps in mentoring came up during the Resilience meeting. Discussed identifying mentoring programs in the community</p> <p>Smoking Cessation – Mike Whitaker, KCHD</p> <p>- Added 11 new clients in January. It is typically a slow month for SC as people don't want to come out in the weather.</p> <p>-Two on-going classes continue at KCH & KCHD</p> <p>-Main Place, Kno-Ho-Co & ? are now providers.</p> <p>-Larry mentioned he has seen many tobacco prevention messages on FB.</p> <p>-Mike states client population has changed – majority list anxiety issues on the application.</p> <p>-Carmen wanted to recognize Mike and Alayna because the number of Tobacco cessation clients served has more than doubled from 2017 to 2018.</p> <p>-Mike plans to meet with service providers individually to provide TA re: CCI completing forms etc.</p>	
<p>Other Business:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Changing Priority Area 3 – Strategy 3 	<p>Shared information regarding Senate and House Bills that will bring Health Education standards to Ohio (Ohio is the only state that doesn't have Health standards), this is a great bill and promotes health as well as "life-skills" but it will separate health education from sexual health education which will limit this groups ability to get into the school and try and bring a comprehensive sex education curriculum to students.</p> <p>-Carmen asked group to approve changes to this strategy. KCHD will be responsible for completion</p> <p>-Year one will stay the same... <i>"Conduct environmental scan of current sexual education and prevention programs."</i></p> <p>-Year two will change to... <i>"Utilizing the findings form the environmental scan create resource guides. To 1) assist parents in discussing risky behaviors with their children and teens and 2)</i></p>

Develop a promotional campaign on talking with children/teens about sexual health with safe, accurate information. Focus on community-based education – including a promotion campaign about safe sex and ed. Materials for parents regarding risky sexual behaviors and how to communicate with youth about these topics.”</i></p> <p>The strategy would become a community wide campaign. Providing toolkits for parents. Austin Johnson, Kenyon Associate Professor, is looking at how to do health promotion campaigns in the community. This class will be developing the toolkits.</p> <p>-Julie noted that STD rates are very high in Knox County.</p> <p><u>Kay</u> moved that we change the strategy to the proposal that Carmen presented. <u>Chris</u> – seconded All were in favor, motion was passed.</p> <p>Carmen submitting two research abstracts to APHA for consideration at their Annual Meeting, one regarding Resiliency and one regarding GHKC</p> <p><i>Julie –</i> Merging KHPP with Nonprofit Public Health Partnership, prior Health Commissioner formed to be able to apply for funding that HD cannot PHP – meets next Monday, goal is to make a formal motion to combine groups. This group approves UW applications for KCHD & Life Saver, merge would allow KHPP to apply for more funding.</p> <p>Julie introduce Paul Hart Ruthenbeck, Health Center’s addiction counselor.</p> <p>Community Health Center is going to open a Danville site. It will open slowly, one day a week with medical services only.</p> <p><i>Larry-</i> – Ext. finished training volunteers on child protection. -Real Money, Real World Program Dates; April 24, 25 & May 9th Locations: MVHS, KCCC, Clear Fork High School</p>
